Basics of Birding 1:30pm

Location: Mariposa Creek Parkway. Meet at the parking area in front of Blackburn Automotive at the north end of Stroming Road at 1:30pm. Short walk to birding area.

<u>County Planning Department walks on newer phases of the Mariposa Creek Parkway</u> (2 Guided Walks):

During the Trails Day event, the county will be leading two guided walks of the Phase IV area to introduce community members to this little known but extremely compelling area. We want to gather ideas and recommendations from interested Mariposans. Walks will be led by county staff (Mikey Goralnik-Planning; Ben Goger-Administration) and will include a range of activities and exercises to collect community input on this future segment of the Mariposa Creek Parkway.

Walk #1 begins at 1:30 pm- and Walk #2 at 3:00 pm (Please arrive a little early so we can leave on time). Group size limit: 7

Location: Meet at the upper end of Antone Road. You may drive, walk, or bike to the meeting point. Both walks will leave from the Creekside Terraces site, located at the upstream end of Antone Road on the west side of Mariposa Creek. Parallel parking will be available along Antone Road, less than ¼ mile upstream from its intersection with Joe Howard Street.

Fly-Fishing Equipment and Casting- 1:30pm

We shall cover how a fly rod works, wading safely in the water, the basic gear needed, and how to know you are casting correctly. Participants may practice, observe, and improve their skills. Participants under the age of 15 should have an adult or older responsible person with them. It is helpful if you have had some prior fishing experience.
